Greenshaw Research School is seeking to increase its capacity to support other schools with their development priorities through the recruitment of Evidence Leads in Education (ELE). These ELEs will contribute to evidence informed school improvement by devoting up to 5 working days a year to support the work of the research school. Applications welcome from primary and secondary colleagues.

Why would you want to become an ELE?

With a thirst to drive forward your own professional development, the opportunity to join Greenshaw Research School as an ELE would mean that you would be adding your voice to the field of evidence in education. Working alongside our funders, the Education Endowment Foundation, also affords opportunities for networking nationally with other research schools and widely recognised voices who generate and mobilise some of the most innovative research in education. Becoming an ELE would also give you the time and space alongside your current role to consider evidence and its usefulness in driving forward school improvement.

What do you need to be an ELE?

You need to be an outstanding teacher - a middle or senior leader - with the skills and passion to support individuals or teams in similar positions in other schools. You will need to understand what outstanding leadership in the use of evidence to inform school practice looks like and be skilled in helping other leaders to achieve it in their own context.



What might your role be?

We are particularly looking for colleagues to support in two different aspects of our work:

- Senior leaders to support school improvement work with partnership schools (primary and secondary);
- Subject specialists to support us in driving forward a strategy for secondary schools in Disciplinary Literacy, particularly with a focus on the subjects of maths and science.

Commitment and cost

Successful applicants must have a commitment to outreach work and the capacity to undertake such work, with the full support of their Headteacher.

There is no cost to apply. Successful applicants will be entitled to training which may be a combination from Greenshaw Research School and the EEF directly. When work is planned and booked, the research school will cover all costs to the ELE's home school.

How do I apply?

Download and complete the application form on the Greenshaw Research School website. Ensure that you have the full support of your Headteacher as they will have to add to the form to detail their commitment to supporting you in the role and also to act as your referee.
