Learn to Read Read to Learn

JULY 2022 – JULY 2023

This programme will support clusters of schools to implement evidence-informed strategies to develop pupils' reading skills at the Key Stage 1/2 transition points. The programme has been co-constructed with Derbyshire headteachers, the EEF, Derby Research School and Derbyshire Local Authority. The programme will consist of three face-to-face CPD inputs throughout the year culminating in a transition project and Learning Gallery event in July. The programme aims to develop collaboration of expertise in the following areas:

1 Curriculum design and sequencing to develop reading skills

2 Pedagogy

3 Pupil transition activity

The KS1- KS2 programme will focus on reading fluency and comprehension to equip pupils to read with confidence and understanding.

- Primary schools and infant/ junior colleagues are invited to join the programme. Each workgroup should include a Year 2 and 3 teacher. English Leads are also invited to join each session to support implementation.
- Opportunities to network and learn from each other in 3 face-to-face training days. Lunch provided.
- The training programme will include CPD input, workgroup-directed activity and professional dialogue opportunities with the programme's facilitators.
- Explore implementation in English lessons and across the curriculum.
- At the end of the year, colleagues will plan a transition activity for the current Year 2 cohort.
- Suitable for teachers in mixed age Key Stage 1 or Key Stage 2 classes as well as single year group classes.
