

Targeted Student Support (secondary)

The project is growing and feedback from parents and secondary schools is very positive. Please contact Shaheen Parekh SPAREKH@landau-forte.org.uk if you require any leaflets on why mid-year admissions/moves can be negative. So far, almost 100 cases involving families and young people have been reviewed, going on to consider managed moves, supported placements and mid-year moves that are normal admissions. A number of external referrals have been completed, providing support for families as well as schools. From September the following extra support will be available through the project:

- Think for the Future mentors appointed to work in selected secondary schools
- Counsellor appointed to address SEMH
- English/Maths tutors to help bridge gap in learning
- Exercise therapy to address anger management



Every school in the city has the opportunity to apply for grant funding of £1,500 or more to develop the emotional health and wellbeing of their school community. Half of the city's schools are already developing their plans to spend this money.

The mission of the Emotionally Healthy Schools project is to train every school in Derby in the leadership of Emotional Health and Wellbeing, and develop a network of Designated Senior Leads for Mental Health from every school, providing ongoing peer to peer support. Almost every school is either already involved or signed up for the final wave of training and support in the new school year. Careers information advice and guidance success!

A recent proposal to the Opportunity Area Board has received funding for some research and analysis that will lay the foundations for a long-term careers strategy for Derby and align with a future D2N2 Careers and Employability Hub.

This work will build on and strengthen the work of the Enterprise Adviser Network to support Derby schools and Derby College to meet their responsibilities stemming from the Government's 2017 Careers Strategy. In addition, it will maximise alignment with the LEP strategy between 2020 and 2023 and a range of additional provision adding value to careers IAG in Derby. In essence, it is a means to establishing a baseline of current performance including identification of gaps, duplication and best practice. It will be developed in partnership with key stakeholders to enable sustainability in the long term. Watch out for more information in the autumn term.

Reducing NEET

Dimensions Training Solutions have recently started delivering the LEP contract to reduce NEET in the area. In terms of referrals, the programmes on offer are available for 'any young person aged between 15-29 who is not currently in any form of employment or

Support from the Research School

The **Research School** is looking forward to continuing to support the Opportunity Area next year after a great start in the delivery of programmes this year: both our Leading Learning and Effective Use and Evaluation of the Pupil Premium.





Leadership Programmes: We have a couple of final places on our leadership programmes, Leading Learning: Leading Effective Professional Development (LL) and the Effective Use and Evaluation of the Pupil Premium (PP)

We are exploring a few options for delivery next year which will be finalised by the OA Board and made available to schools going forward. For schools who have participated in our LL and PP programmes, these offer a good next step. There will be coaching and follow up support for the programmes.

NEW: Teaching for Memory Lead Programme and Metacognition Lead Programme: Support schools in embedding the principles covered in our LL and PP programmes.

NEW: Research Lead Programme: Supporting schools in developing class-based research projects as a driver for evidence engagement and improving teaching and learning.

Family Engagement

This innovative area of work is making some great strides forward, with projects and activity underway in a number of Derby schools. Each participating school is tailoring their work to address their family and community priorities. Looking forward, a few highlights from the programme include:

- Part of the 'This is Derby' celebration event on 13th July
- Family Day at The University of Derby for a number of secondary schools, in collaboration with DANCOP (July 6th)

TALK Derby city-wide and local offer

Funding for transition projects this year

The Transitions Working Group has reviewed the Expressions of Interest for Transition Mini Projects that were submitted and is currently finalising their decisions with the applicant schools. As a result, some fantastic work will be underway next year, including:

- Developing a city-wide protocol and a 'Derby Approach to Transition"
- Creating a city-wide Common Transfer Form for all secondary schools, then web-enabling it and linking it to other systems to reduce workload and avoid repetition
- · Creating transition guidance and best practice examples for
 - Science Year 4 Year 7
 - English KS2 KS3
 - Home to School Reading for EYFS
 - Arrangements for SEND and vulnerable students
 - Preparing for secondary school
- The Secondary Information Exchange Event will be improved and repeated next year, using a single form (notifying schools in plenty of time!) that is also well-aligned the new arrangements for Primary In-Year Fair Access.
- The Transitions Leads Network had a positive first meeting in June and will meet four times next
 year as the forum where this programme of work will be shared and developed for the benefit of the

TEACH Derby

Next year will see a growing programme of collaborative work organised by the partnership of ITT/ITE organisations (teacher training) that serve Derby. They have obtained funding through the Opportunity Area Board for:

- City-wide **promotional work** to attract people into teaching careers. This will include a single website to link all training providers, promotional films and events, plus training in PR and social media.
- A major **CPD Programme** for up to 100 Derby teachers who are in the **second year** of their career to build on their NQT year and continue their development.
- School **internships** to fuel the interest of potential future teachers.

Before the end of term: Year 6 writing for secondary schools

All schools with Year 6 pupils (plus the Year 7 and Transition leads in secondary schools) have recently received information about the transfer of a piece of independent writing for each pupil to secondary schools. They will use it to establish consistent minimum expectations across subjects in September and so hopefully reduce any dips in pupil's writing achievement. This idea has attracted a lot of support from
